Girl Scouts of the USA Relaxes Fundraising Policy

Also GSUSA has relaxed the official fundraising policy in response to the emergency conditions created by Hurricane Katrina. The National Board of Directors made the decision to adopt a special rule of order which temporarily suspends the policy restricting girls' involvement in direct fundraising for outside organizations, as noted in Safety-Wise. It will

allow girl members to engage in activities, which may include the direct solicitation of money, from September 12, 2005, through May 31, 2006, to support emergency relief for the Hurricane Katrina disaster. Groups do not donate to individuals, but work with established organizations that are serving individuals, including their own Girl Scout organization. Collections of monies can be given only to the outside

organizations on the list from USA F r e e d o m C o r p (http:www.usafreedomcorps.gov)

ABOUT THE SURVEY...

This conference will be the way our area can get together and get the

Lastly, October's TLC focus should be on making sure new leaders know what programs are coming up for their age level. Be sure they have plenty of notice to prepare their girls for any of the Service Unit's upcoming events. Juliette Low Birthday celebrations, holiday service projects and traditional Service Unit events need to be pointed out. Then help them determine how their girls can participate in the things they want to.
