## Steps to Successful Event Registration

### DO:

- USE THE WEBSITE! At <http://www.girlscoutsnwga.org> in the “Events and Things to Do – Program Events” section, you’ll find up to the minute information about upcoming events for your age group, full event descriptions, event changes or cancellations and registration instructions. From the “Events and Things to Do – Main” page you can download the most up to date registration and permission forms. Most forms are now writeable PDFs. Just fill them out, print them out and you’re off!
- Include payment with your registration form if applicable! Most events with a 600 accounting code require **payment with registration**. Most events with a 500 accounting code require **payment upon confirmation**. Directions for payment are found in the “Fee” section of each event description. See attached samples.
- Use the correct form and fill it out completely. Please include your email address! The event description tells you which form to use. There are three forms:
  - Event Registration Form for Individuals – 600 events in which you are participating as an individual rather than with your troop
  - Event Registration Form for Troop Events – 600 events and 500 day events
  - Troop Camping Application – this is used for 500 overnight program events at camp (Brownie Adventure, etc.) It **MUST** be signed by your Service Unit Director. We will return registrations which are unsigned or submitted on an incorrect form.
- Be on the look out for your “Registration Received” email within a week to ten days of sending your registration. **THIS DOES NOT CONFIRM YOUR EVENT PLACEMENT**, but does confirm receipt of your registration. If you don’t receive this email, we may not have received your registration.
- Two weeks before the event, you should receive another email with your event status information. This email will tell you whether the event is happening and if you are confirmed for it. If you are not confirmed (the event was full, cancelled, etc.) your options will be outlined. If you **ARE** confirmed, this email will contain all of the event information including directions, what to bring, and whom to contact for more information. For events with a 500 accounting code, this information will come 4 – 6 weeks before an event.

### DON'T:

- Send your form in before the beginning registration date outlined in the event description. The beginning registration date is the date on which your form should be **POSTMARKED**, not the day it should arrive.
- Fax your registration form. We must have the original form and your payment in order to process your registration.
- Send credit card information. We cannot accept credit cards as payment for program events.

## Event Description Examples for Registration

### Brownie Adventure Overnight

This event is for troops who have never tent camped before. Activities include songs, games, crafts, swimming, a talent show and eating in our dining hall. Troops stay in platform tent units that have eight tents, four cots with mattresses per tent, a unit shelter, flushing toilets and hot showers. Cabin units are also available for \$5 additional per participant during September dates. Please indicate on your application if your troop would like to request a tent or cabin unit. When cabins are full, you will be placed in a tent. Tag-alongs or girls who are not Brownie Girl Scouts will not be admitted. No return troops, please.

**Accounting code:** 506/troop

**Program level/age:** Brownie Girl Scouts

**Date:** Sept. 14-15, 2007 and Sept. 15-16, 2007; April 11-12, 2008, April 12-13, 2008, April 18-19, 2008 and April 19-20, 2008

**Time:** 7 p.m. first day-3:30 p.m. the next day

**Location:** Camp Timber Ridge, Mableton

**Fee:** \$25 per girl, \$12 per adult; **send no money with registration, payment due upon receipt of confirmation**

**Registration:** Begins April 1, 2007 for September 2007 dates; Dec. 1, 2007 for April 2008 dates; **use an Application/Reservation for Troop Camping form and write Brownie Adventure across the top**

**Participants:** Min. 75/max. 225, adults are limited to Safety-Wise ratios

**Adult training required:** First aid/CPR, Cabin Camping and Platform Tent Camping

**Location:** Six Flags White Water Park, Marietta

**Fee:** \$36 per person; **send payment with registration**

**Registration:** Begins July 1, 2007; ends Aug. 18, 2007

**Participants:** Min. 100/max. 1,000

**Adult training required:** First aid/CPR
